Tikait, Yogendra...

In a statement, the Morcha said, "The Union government has been severely shaken by this peasant agitation. Therefore, a dirty conspiracy was hatched with Kisan Mazdoor Sangharsh Committee and others."

It alleged that these outfits had set up their own separate protest site after 15 days of the beginning of this farmers' agitation. "They were not part of the organisations which jointly undertook the struggle," the statement claimed.

Trap kills...

"It was a clutch wire used in vehicles. A case has been registered against unidentified persons under the Wildlife Protection Act and search is underway for culprits. Six people have been rounded up, said an official. An autopsy was conducted on Wednesday as per rules of the National Tiger Conservation Authority. The body was found intact and no body part was missing, he said.

Officials feel that the trap was probably laid to hunt wild board or deer and not for tiger but unfortunately it fell for the tigers. However, experts feel that managing and maintaining increasing numbers of tigers are now a new challenge for the forest officials. At present there are 84 tigers in the KTR. 'In absence of 'secured territory' tigers have started frequenting buffer areas where they often fall to poachers through traps and electrocution,' said an official requesting anonymity.

KTR has 84 tigers in its forest that comprise of 940 sq km of core area and 1134 sq km of buffer area. Going by the average movement of tiger of about 30 sq km per day, tigers in the KTR require about 2100 sq km of forest area, said the official. 'This probably seems to be one of the main reasons that tigers have started frequenting the buffer zones,' added official.

Retired APCCF LK Chowdhary said that now forest officials need to remain more alert. The forest staff has always a challenge not to allow any unnatural death in their area.

Girl's parents...

On Tuesday, some Bajrang Dal workers reached the center after getting information about the religious conversion. They created ruckus there forcing the police to intervene. Later, the complainant reached the police station and lodged a complaint.

TI Duddhi said 9 people including girl's parents were arrested on Wednesday and they were produced in the court from where they were sent to jail. A search is on for two other accused.

UP attracts investment worth Rs 57,000 crore

The Uttar Pradesh government has attracted over 77 investment intents from companies from 10 countries — Japan, the UK, the US, Canada, Germany, South Korea, Singapore — worth Rs57,000 crore. It has introduced digital tracking mechanism for MoUs. Active engagement of investors, nodal departments and nodal officers on the online MoU tracking portal has been mandated. Also, monthly review of the progress is monitored.

Awanish Kumar Awasthi, additional chief secretary (home) when questioned what steps taken to attract investors as UP is known for

mafia and is criticised for poor law and order over the years, he replied, "Zero tolerance approach has been adopted. Property valuing about Rs900 crore seized by the government, illegally acquired including mafias and goons. We are taking strict action and no one is spared for illegal activities."

Interestingly, by introducing reformed action plan ensuring ease of doing business, the state ranking in Business Report Action Plan by DPIIT, Govt of India has ranked UP on 2nd position. The state implemented 186 reforms and one of the major reforms was digital single window portal providing 166 services to the entrepreneurs.

Sasikala a free bird, but still in hospital

Former AIADMK general secretary VK Sasikala, 66, was released on Wednesday after spending 4 years in a jail here in a Rs66 crore disproportionate assets case. Despite the release, she will not be a free person as she has to remain at the Victoria Hospital where she is being treated for Covid-19.

Officials of the Central Jail in Bengaluru's Parappana Agrahara completed the formalities of her release at the hospital. She will continue staying at the hospital for 4-5 days more, sources said.

"She is not fit for discharge as of Wednesday. She is being given intermittent oxygen supply and is stable. She will have to stay in the hospital for 3 more days," they said. Supporters plan to give

Sasikala a warm welcome all the way from Bengaluru to Chennai. Her supporters have already started camping at Victoria Hospital waiting for her release.

Meanwhile, after visiting her aunt after her formal release, TTV Dinakaran said "Chinamma is coming back, we will form Amma's government in Tamil Nadu."

Her supporters echoed the views of Dinakaran. Her close associates say on arrival in Chennai, Sasikala would start opening channels of communications with leaders who had openly supported her in the past. Having worked closely with the former CM Jayalalitha, Sasikala knows the strengths and weaknesses of all the leaders and use it to her advantage. Though she cannot contest the polls, she may try to prop up Dhinakaran's party, the AMMK.

'Give UT status for disputed Maha-K'taka border areas'

Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray on Wednesday said areas dominated by Marathi-speaking people on the state's border with Karnataka should be declared as a Union Territory till the Supreme Court gives its final verdict on the issue.

Speaking at the launch of a book on the boundary dispute between the two states, Thackeray lashed out at the Karnataka government over alleged atrocities on Marathi-speaking population in those areas, and said there is a need to fight to win the case for their inclusion in Maharashtra.

Maharashtra claims certain areas, including Belgaum, Karwar and Nippani which are part of Karnataka, contending the majority of

population in these areas is Marathi-speaking.

The case over the dispute between the two states is pending before the Supreme Court for many years.

Thackeray said, "When the case is being heard in the Supreme Court, the Karnataka government renames Belgaum (as Belagavi) declares it as its second capital, constructs a Legislature building and holds one legislature session there." "Isn't this contempt of court?" Thackeray asked.

He said the "Karnataka-occupied Marathi-speaking areas should be declared as a Union Territory" till the Supreme Court gives its final verdict.

"We have to learn from past experiences and fight to win. The Karnataka-occupied Marathi-speaking areas will be included in Maharashtra," he asserted.



The chief minister also targeted the Maharashtra Ekikaran Samiti (MES) for allegedly weakening the Marathi cause for selfish political interests.

The MES is an organisation fighting for the merger of 800-odd villages, where the Marathi-speaking population is dominant, with Maharashtra.

"Earlier, the MES had half-a-dozen MLAs, Belgaum mayor used to be a Marathi-speaking person. The Shiv Sena never entered the political fray in Belgaum because

Over 100 injured in police-teacher clash

AGARTALA: At least 87 teachers and 17 police personnel were injured in a pitched battle on Wednesday with the security forces knocking down the tents in which thousands of Tripura government school teachers, who had lost their jobs following the court's verdict, have been holding sit-in protest for the past 52 days demanding restoration of their jobs. Inspector General of Police (Law and Order) Arindam Nath said that 223 agitating teachers were arrested as they assembled near the official residence of Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb.

Solar case to CBI: LDF plays into Oppn hands

After having announced a CBI probe into the solar case just in time for the assembly election, the ruling front seems to have quickly realised it may have tripped down on decision.

The front leader CPI-M is taking great pains to explain solar will not be an electoral issue and it is only the opposition that is trying to keep it alive. LDF convener, who is doubling up as the state party secretary A Vijayaraghavan, told media the government would seek a second term based on performance.

The opposition, whose leaders including former CM Oommen Chandy and his ministerial and party colleagues have been accused of sexually abusing a woman entrepreneur in return of government approvals, was quick to play the victim card, saying the Pinarayi Vijayan government could not move an inch to prosecute the accused in its 5 years in power.

Public perception about the government move has been rather negative, as it is viewed as desperate attempt to flog a dead horse, as the case has been probed by at least 3 teams, none of which make any headway due to lack of credible evidence.

After a short euphoria over the opposition's embarrassment, the ruling front has realised it may have played

into the hands of the UDF, which is accusing the government of using the case to counter its own predicament over allegations of large-scale corruption and nepotism, apart from the high-octane gold smuggling-havala scams. Chandy, named the chief of the election machinery by the party high command, has said he would not take any legal action against CBI probe and the UDF would instead go to the people's court. He said he never obstructed the case even when he was the CM.

UDF leaders have claimed the decision is politically motivated and it stems from the LDF's losing confidence about its electoral prospects. It now emerges the decision was taken by the CM without discussing it in cabinet meet.

ADMK invokes Jaya legacy

Ahead of polls, opens memorial for late leader on Marina beach

Months ahead of the Tamil Nadu Assembly poll, the ruling AIADMK on Wednesday sought to cash in on the political legacy of J Jayalalitha by unveiling a mausoleum for her on the Marina beach front in Chennai.

Thousands of AIADMK cadres, throwing COVID-19 safety protocol to the winds, milled their way into the memorial within hours of it being inaugurated by Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami. The memorial is situated alongside the MGR memorial and those of DMK founder CN Annadurai and his successor M Karunanidhi. Many AIADMK cadres were seen visiting Karunanidhi's burial place as well prompting Fisheries Minister D Jayakumar to declare that they were not true followers of Jay-



alalitha. Making a political point, Palaniswami attacked DMK president MK Stalin saying he had tried to obstruct construction of the memorial for Jayalalitha by getting people to move the court against it. These cases were withdrawn overnight when the DMK had moved the Madras High Court seeking that party patriarch Karunanidhi's body be laid to rest next to the Anna Memorial, he said.

Stalin, however, hit back saying a memorial was constructed for someone who was convicted by the courts in corruption cases and unseated from the post of chief minister.

Meanwhile, in a related development, the Madras High Court has imposed restrictions on the state government's plan to unveil Jayalalitha's imposing Veda Nilayam bungalow in Chennai's posh Poes Garden locality as a memorial.

SC declines relief from arrest to 'Tandav' actor, makers

The Supreme Court on Wednesday refused to grant interim protection from arrest to actor Mohammad Zeeshan Ayyub and makers of web series 'Tandav' and allowed them to approach High Courts for relief from arrest or quashing of FIRs.

A Bench of Justices Ashok Bhushan, R Subhash Reddy and MR Shah agreed to hear the issue of transferring and clubbing several FIRs registered against them across the country and issued notice to complainants on the prayer.

Ayyub, head of Amazon Prime Video (India), and the makers have approached the top court seeking protection from arrest on the FIRs registered against them for allegedly hurting religious sentiments and telecasting objectionable content.

During the hearing, senior advocate Fali Nariman appearing for web series makers told the Apex Court that some objectionable contents were removed and apologies were made.

"The so-called religious sentiments that hurt the people were removed," Nariman said adding that nothing survives in the case now.

Nariman said the FIRs are lodged in different states and are being filed every day. "Ego has been hurt and we have removed the content," he added.

Poet Rao is stable, reject his medical bail plea: NIA to HC

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Wednesday urged the Bombay High Court to reject the plea for bail on medical grounds filed by poet-activist Varavara Rao, arrested in the Elgar-Parishad-Maoist links case, arguing that his present health condition is stable.

Additional Solicitor General Anil Singh, who appeared for the NIA, reminded the court that Rao's medical reports from the Nanavati Hospital, from earlier this month, stated

that he was stable and fit to be discharged.

He pointed out that the Maharashtra government had made a statement before the HC last week, saying once discharged from the private hospital, Rao (81) will not be sent back to the Taloja prison in Navi Mumbai, but instead, he will be admitted to the prison ward of state-run JJ Hospital here and given requisite medical care.

"His (Rao's) medical reports, his present health condition is stable, and the state's statement takes care of all the prayers made in these pleas,"

Singh said.

"Therefore, the question of granting him bail arises only if the court doesn't have faith in the care that the JJ Hospital will be able to provide," Singh told a bench of Justices SS Shinde and Manish Patil.

The bench was hearing three petitions — a writ petition seeking Rao's complete medical records and a bail plea on medical grounds filed by Rao. The third one is a writ petition filed by Rao's wife Hemlatha alleging a breach of his fundamental rights owing to lack of medical care during his continued incarceration.

Bharat Biotech to make antigen for first-ever anti-malaria vaccine

Global healthcare company GSK, non-profit agency working to end health inequity PATH, and vaccine maker Bharat Biotech on Wednesday announced the signing of a product transfer agreement for malaria vaccine RTS,S/AS01E1.

The agreement includes the transfer of manufacturing of the RTS,S antigen part of the vaccine and the grant of a license on all rights pertaining to the RTS,S/AS01 malaria

vaccine to Hyderabad-based Bharat Biotech International Ltd (BBIL). GSK will retain the production of the adjuvant of the vaccine (AS01E) and will supply it to Bharat Biotech. BBIL was selected through a comprehensive, competitive process undertaken by GSK and PATH, working in consultation with the World Health Organisation (WHO), the vaccine maker said in a statement here.

The RTS,S/AS01E malaria vaccine, developed by GSK for more than 30 years, and in part-

nership with PATH since 2001, is currently being piloted in regions of Ghana, Kenya, and Malawi under the Malaria Vaccine Implementation Programme (MVIP). Ministries of Health concerned are leading the implementation of the vaccine, which is being given to young children through the three countries' routine immunisation programmes, with WHO providing technical and scientific leadership, playing a coordinating role, and working in collaboration with GSK, PATH, and a range of other

partners. RTS,S/AS01E is the first, and to date, the only malaria vaccine to have received a positive review by regulatory authorities (positive scientific opinion) from the European Medicines Agency and approval by the regulatory authorities of Ghana, Kenya, and Malawi for use in the MVIP).

The first dose of the vaccine has reached more than 500,000 children since the pilots were initiated by Ministries of Health in the three participating countries in 2019. This agreement

with BBIL is the result of efforts by GSK, PATH, and WHO to help ensure long-term sustainable vaccine supply in the event of a WHO policy recommendation for broader use and a commitment of sustained funding. This builds on existing GSK commitments to donate up to 10 million RTS,S/AS01E doses for use in the pilot, and to supply up to 15 million doses annually until 2028 if the product is recommended for wider use by WHO.

It is expected that by 2029, at the latest, BBIL

will be the sole supplier of the vaccine, with GSK supplying the adjuvant AS01E to them.

"With a child still dying of malaria every two minutes, helping secure the long-term future of the only vaccine available by working with an established leader like Bharat Biotech is vital for the continued fight against this devastating disease. GSK is delighted to sign this agreement with Bharat Biotech," said Thomas Breuer, GSK Vaccines Chief Medical Officer and Vaccines Global Health lead.
