IAS officer Lokesh Kumar Jangid has courted a fresh controversy. He made a disputed statement on WhatsApp group of the IAS Association after being removed from the post of collector of Barwani.

SHAHDOL VIDEO PUT ON STATUS

IAS officer Lokesh Jangid has put on his status a three-year-old video in which BJP leaders are seen protesting against his removal from Shahdol. Jangid was sub-divisional magistrate there. He was removed, since he was not on good terms with the then collector Naresh Pal. At that time, chairman of the district Panchayat demonstrated in favour of Jangid. In his status, he has written: "Imandari aisa mahenga shauk hein kisi ki bute ki baat nahin hein (Honesty is such a costly hobby only few can maintain it)." He further writes: "Imandari tera kirdar hein to khudkushi kar lein; siasi daur ko to ji hujuri ki zarurat hein (If honesty is part of your life, commit suicide; rulers need a yes man.)"

ceived a phone call from the General Administration Department (GAD) that madam Mukherjee told he had been transferred to Bhopal.

The GAD asked him to join his new place of posting.

Jangid further said that when his friends had wanted to know whether he was transferred, he had sent the audio to his four colleagues as personal message.

There was nothing confidential in the audio that he had leaked, nor, had he let out any secrecy by violating professional ethics.

Before his talks over phone, his transfer order had been issued and posted to the GAD website, Jangid said, adding that he was asked to reply to the notice within seven days and he would do that.

Vaccination drive to be launched at 7K centres on June 21, says CM

Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has said that the vaccination drive will be launched at 7,000 centres on June 21—International Yoga Day.

The drive will begin at 10am. Chouhan has further said that a vaccination motivator will be sent to each centre.

The motivator may be a renowned person, such as a minister, a legislator, a member of a crisis management group, a religious leader, a social worker, an artiste, a player, a litterateur, a journalist, a Padma-awarded



teacher or an officer. People above 18 years of age will be vaccinated free of cost, because getting vaccinated is the only way to keep Covid-19 at bay. Therefore, one should get the vials for protection, as well as inspire others to do

that, he said. At a video conferencing in Mantralaya on Thursday, Chouhan said that the way the state had brought the second wave of Covid-19 under control, it would not let a possible third wave have any impact on

the state. Chouhan addressed all crisis management groups in the districts, blocks, wards and villages through video-conferencing.

The corona pandemic has again begun in many countries, such as England, so people should remain vigilant about it.

Everyone should wear masks, avoid crowds and maintain social distancing norms, Chouhan said. He said that arrangements should be made for bringing elderly people to the vaccination centres and those who cannot come to the centres should be vaccinated in their homes.

Refund exam fees of students of Classes 10 and 12: BJP MLA

After NSUI (National Students' of India), BJP MLA Narain Tripathi has also urged Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan to return the exam fee of students of class 10 and 12 as exams are not being held.

BJP MLA from Maihar, Tripathi has requested the Chief Minister to instruct the Madhya Pradesh Board of Secondary Education to refund examination fee of students of class 10 and 12. The exams for both the classes have been cancelled considering the safety of children in view of pandemic.

"The state education board has saved all the money earned in the form of exam fee. Board has saved the exam copies, question papers and other expenses

meant for holding exams," said MLA Tripathi.

Corona has laid an adverse impact on all sections of the society and considering this fact the education board should return the exam fee, he added.

Earlier, the students' wing of Congress, NSUI had also demanded refund of exam fee and had met the board officials.

Moreover, the Madhya Pradesh Palak Mahasangh has also made similar demand citing financial stress created by Covid-19.

The education board charges about Rs 900 as exam fee from students. This year the board had charged an additional fee up to Rs 10,000 as a late fee. More than 19 lakh students of class 10 and 12 had deposited the examination fee this year. The total amount of fee given to the MP

However, school education minister, Inder Singh Parmar had said categorically that school will not be refunded as question papers have been printed and all arrangements made. 'We were ready to conduct exams but it was in the interest of students that exams were cancelled. Question of refund of fee does not arise,' Parmar had said on Tuesday.

Rai accused of committing anomaly in Ayodhya Trust

BHOPAL: Congress committee has lodged a police complaint against Cham-pat Rai, a trustee of Sri Ram Janam Bhoomi Trust in Ayodhya, alleging financial irregularities. A group of Congress leaders reached Habiganj police station on Thursday and demanded an FIR against the accused.

Former minister and MLA PC Sharma, district Congress president Kailash Mishra, OBC cell president JP Dhanopia and others reached Habiganj police station on Thursday and handed over a complaint. Sharma said the 'irregularity' must be probed as Rai has allegedly usurped Rs 16.5 crore of the trust.

City Superintendent of Police (CSP) Habiganj Virendra Mishra said the complaint is taken and an inquiry will be carried out. He said no FIR was lodged as yet.

BURHANPUR AND BHIND ARE COVID-FREE

Barring Bhopal and Indore, 50 dists report cases under 10

Burhanpur and Bhind became coronavirus free as the two districts reported no active cases on Thursday. Barring Bhopal and Indore, 50 districts reported cases under 10 on the day. The state corona positivity rate stands at 0.1 per cent.

The state corona case-load went to 7,88,954 as it reported 145 new cases. So far 8,679 people have died fighting the infection in the state. The number of active cases have dropped to 2984.

Around 73,632 samples were sent for testing while 502 were rejected on the day.

Indore reported 34 fresh cases, the infection tally is 1,52,692 and toll 1374. With

24 new cases, the tally has climbed to 1,22,946. Indore active cases have come down to 533 and Bhopal 1015. In Bhopal, 5947 samples were sent for testing. Gwalior and Jabalpur reported 3 and 9 corona cases respectively and their active cases are 13 and 96 respectively.

No new case was detected in districts including Sagar, Satna, Narsingpur, Hoshangabad, Anuppur, Sidhi, Singrauli, Dewas, Chhattarpur, Panna, Tikamgarh, Shahjapur, Umaria, Mandla, Guna, Dindori, Khandwa, Sheopur, Alirajpur, Agar-Malwa, Bhind and Burhanpur. Their active cases in these districts are 73, 12, 11, 45, 43, 12, 10, 9, 13, 29, 17, 30, 9, 10, 5, 7, 14, 4, 16 and 0 and 0 respectively.

Ashok Nagar, Seoni, Dandia, Jhabua, Neemuch, Damoh, Barwani, Balaghat, Raisen, Sehore and Ratlam reported one case each and their active cases are 28, 27, 17, 13, 30, 95, 15, 12, 35, 13 and 170 respectively.

Healthcare professionals say that, if children are vaccinated, they will be totally safe in the third wave in the country. Delay in children vaccination aged 12 years or above, leaves them to infection in possible third wave.

Madhya Pradesh High Court had pulled up the state government over the preparations for a likely third wave, stating that it was not justified to rearrange the facilities for making preparations for handling such an eventuality. It would be better to enhance facilities for children in the hospitals, the high court maintained. The high court's instructions clearly reflect that rearranging the facilities will cause unnecessary delay in providing better care for children in the

likely scenario of a third wave. Bharat Biotech and Cadila have already started trials for children. More pharmaceutical companies should be given permission for trials as it will increase the volume of vaccines for speedy inoculation and will solve the problem of vaccine shortage.

Night curfew on weekdays, Janta curfew on Sunday

Dewas collector and district magistrate Chandramouli Shukla superseding all the orders of Corona curfew issued earlier, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, Epidemic Disease Act, 1897 and National Disaster Management Act-2005, has issued restrictive/Corona curfew orders in the revenue limits of Dewas district till further orders.

According to the issued order, there will be night curfew in the entire dis-

trict from 10.00 pm to 6.00 am every day. There will be Janta Curfew every Sunday in the entire district, which will be effective from 10:00 pm on Saturday to 06:00 am on Monday. Essential services will be allowed during this period. Collector Shukla directed that the police station in-charge and revenue officer, competent officers of urban and rural bodies of the area concerned should also issue information about the order to the general public. Violation of this order will be an offence punishable under Section 188 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.
